Sermon: When God Moves In

Read Matthew 6 (Focus on Matthew 6:10)

Questions:

1. Why did Jesus teach us to pray "Your Kingdom Come?"
2. Why do you think "Your kingdom come" is placed right before "Your will be done"? How are the two ideas connected?
3. We often want "our kingdom come, our will be done." What is one area of your life where you are currently struggling to let go of your own plans in favor of God's?
4. Do you think the Lord's prayer is connected to submission? How?
5. The word "submission" often feels like losing or being controlled. However, if God is a "Good Father" (v. 8) who knows what you need before you ask, how could submitting to Him actually lead to freedom rather than restriction?
6. In your own words, what does it look like for God's "Kingdom" to come?
